In between meetings, we stay in touch and ask burning questions via our **mailing list** -- a great way to solve problems quickly when your Linux box is acting up.

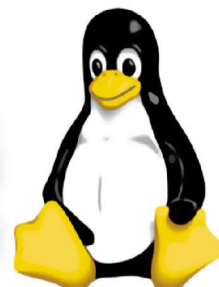
